

RÉJEAN NADEAU, PRESIDENT AND CEO OF OLYMEL L.P. RECOGNIZED BY THE CONSEIL DE LA TRANSFORMATION ALIMENTAIRE DU QUÉBEC (CTAQ)

Saint-Hyacinthe, March 28, 2019 – On March 23, the Conseil de la Transformation Alimentaire du Québec (CTAQ) paid a vibrant tribute to Olymel's President and CEO, Réjean Nadeau, in front of hundreds of industry representatives during its annual conference in Québec City.
